foundations and the roof trusses and wall frames are currently being erected. A new accessible bathroom, relocated resident room, a consulting space for doctors and visiting specialists, and a meeting room will be in use shortly.

Our opportunities to act as industry leaders continue through our association with NIACC. We have recently finalised a tender for hotel consumables and cleaning supplies, which has seen Koonambil transition to a new supplier and new products. Benefits include cost savings, decreased environmental impact and benefits to our residents' wellbeing.

Our next tender process is for power, and involves an audit of our current practices and the investigation of an energy saving scheme before the consideration of a solar option. Again, this process places Koonambil at the forefront of our industry.

Koonambil has recently undergone two audits and passed both with flying colours. NSW Food Authority have conducted their annual audit of the Koonambil kitchen and we have retained our A1 rating. Our annual financial audit has also been completed successfully and satisfactorily. The auditor's full report will be available at our AGM.
